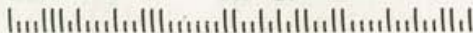

Moreover, dollar amounts awarded are a function of the need for "last dollar" federal support by a potential grantee. Apparently, private schools are more dependent on Title VII dollars for their generalist infrastructures and that generalist education in institutions with a generalist infrastructure has a career impact that is sustained even through residency. Some public schools require less "last dollar" support than others regardless of production rate, and this phenomenon confounds the effect of Title VII dollar support as a significant predictor in public schools.

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
